## **Appraisal Institute Education Trust Honors Dallas' Charles Dannis**

CHICAGO (Aug. 9, 2016) – Charles G. Dannis, MAI, SRA, of Dallas, received the Dr. William N. Kinnard Jr. Academic Award; Stephen D. Roach, MAI, SRA, AI-GRS, of San Diego, received the James H. Pritchett Award; Bradley R. Carter, MAI, of Atlanta, received the George L. Schmutz Award; and Byron E. Miller, SRA, AI-RRS, of Minneapolis, Minnesota, received the Y.T. and Louise Lee Lum Award from the Appraisal Institute Education Trust during the Appraisal Institute Annual Conference July 27 in Charlotte, North Carolina.

The Appraisal Institute is the nation's largest professional association of real estate appraisers with nearly 20,000 professionals in almost 60 countries. The Appraisal Institute Education Trust fosters the advancement of the real estate appraisal profession and plays a critical role in supporting the Appraisal Institute's education programs.

Originally established by the Society of Real Estate Appraisers, the Dr. William N. Kinnard Jr. Academic Award acknowledges professionalism in education. The criteria for this award require the recipient to be an academic instructor or administrator, or an individual or a program that contributed to the education, knowledge, professionalism or development of the real estate appraisal field. Honorees are selected by the trustees of the Appraisal Institute Education Trust.

Dannis was selected because of his long-standing devotion to the Appraisal Institute's education program and his commitment to excellence. In addition to his work on behalf of the Appraisal Institute, he has shared his extensive knowledge and passion for the valuation profession to other organizations, including Southern Methodist University.

Dannis has served on many Appraisal Institute committees that have helped enhance the education of numerous appraisers, including serving on the AI Symposium Committee for 10 years. His contributions to the real estate appraisal field – through course development of advanced topics and complex subject matter – have furthered the body of knowledge.

Dannis currently serves as senior managing director for National Valuation Consultants, one of the largest privately held commercial real estate valuation and advisory companies in the United States with a focus on institutional real estate clients. Previously, he spent nearly 40 years as president of Crosson Dannis, a full service real estate appraisal and consulting firm operating throughout the United States.

Established in 2002, the James H. Pritchett Award recognizes a Designated Member of the Appraisal Institute for outstanding contributions to appraisal education or mentoring in a manner that reflects the character and lifelong commitment of James H. Pritchett, MAI, SRA, whose greatest attributes included his leadership and integrity, often demonstrated by his exceptional work in teaching, writing, mentoring and professional practice in litigation support and eminent domain. Recommendations for this award come from the Atlanta Area Chapter of the Appraisal Institute, and the final decision is made by Pritchett, Ball & Wise, Inc., the firm that Mr. Pritchett founded in 1954.

Established in 1959, the George L. Schmutz Award recognizes an outstanding technical manuscript or publication on real estate valuation regardless of the author's occupation, affiliation or publisher. The winner is selected by the Appraisal Institute's Publications Review Panel.

The Y.T. and Louise Lee Lum Award was established in 1963 and honors Y.T. Lum – a prominent member of the American Institute of Real Estate Appraisers, an internationally known speaker, and authority on real estate – and his wife, Louise Lee. The purpose of the Y.T. and Louise Lee Lum Award is to recognize one or more worthy individuals who have made a distinguished contribution to the appraisal profession during the immediate preceding year. The Y.T. and Louise Lee Lum Award is open to Appraisal Institute professionals, as well as those who do not belong to the Appraisal Institute.

The Y.T. and Louise Lee Lum Award is given in recognition of, and great appreciation for, the distinguished contribution to the furtherance of the high ideals of the profession of real estate appraising and practices, mindful of the fact that this contribution was possible only through the zeal, uprightness, sacrifice, devotion, acumen and ability of the contributor. The winner is selected by the trustees of the Appraisal Institute Education Trust.
